MISSION STATEMENT



Priests, deacons and seminarians of Rome, representing the Vatican (St. Peter's) Cricket Team, will embark on the 4th Light of Faith Tour (of England) this summer, from Tuesday 3rd to Sunday, 15th of July. Matches will be played against a Stonyhurst XI at Stonyhurst College (Manchester), against a Commonwealth XI at the Indian Gymkhana

Ground, with local teams at Walthamstow, against the Houses of Parliament XI at Chiswick House, and against the Royal Household Cricket Club at Windsor.

Of notable interest is the Inter-faith match at the Nursery Ground at Lord's, where The Vatican (St. Peter's) and the Archbishop of Canterbury's joint team will play an interfaith team of Muslims, Sikhs, Hindus, Buddhists and members of the Jewish faith. The

Vatican (St. Peter's) XI will also be making informal visits to a Muslim Mosque, a Hindu

temple, a Sikh Gurdwara, and a Jewish synagogue, to underline the vital importance of authentic religious experience for society and also to emphasise the bonds among major religions.

The Vatican (St. Peter's) XI will also dedicate a day of their tour to visit one of Her Majesty's Prisons and Young Offenders Institutions and play a match there. The team will be received at 10 Downing St. on Friday, 13th July, at 2pm. The Vatican (St. Peter's) Team continues to build bridges between cultures and religions through the sport of cricket and, in a simple way, to give witness to their Catholic priesthood and to their Faith.

HISTORY

St. Peter's CC was founded in 2013 by the former Ambassador of Australia to the Holy See, John McCarthy. The British Amassadors to the Holy See, Nigel Baker, and Sally Axworthy, are also supporters of the team and sit on its executive council.

The team is lead by;

Fr. Eamonn O'Higgins, LC, Professor of Political Philosophy at the Pontifical Atheneum Regina Apostolorium and Spiritual Director at the Pontifical College Maria Mater Ecclesiae, serves as the manager of the team.

Fr. Sameer Advani, LC, Professor of Phenomology and Philosopher of Religion, and Director of the Christianity and Culture program at Regina Apostolorum, serves as Director of Operations and Development for St. Peter's.

OUR OBJECTIVES

The team's objectives are to increase the awareness of the importance of religion for society, promote ecumenical, inter-religious, and inter-cultural dialogue, spread the Christian Gospel, and draw attention to important social issues. Cricket matches thus serve as platforms to bring different religious and ethnic-cultural communities together and promote what Pope Francis has called the 'culture of encounter and dialogue'. Inthis way the team seeks to engage and challenge leaders in the areas of religion, politics, sport, media, and culture to work together for the common good.

INTERNATIONAL TOURS

As a means to these ends, St. Peter's has played several high-profile matches in its short history, engaging in three 'Light of Faith Tours'.

In 2014 and 2016 they toured England playing matches against Anglican, Muslim, and Hindu-Sikh teams at some of the most iconic grounds in the country; Headingley in Yorkshire, Edgbaston in Birmingham, and the Kent Spitfires Ground in Canterbury. Visits to Canterbury Cathedral, York Minster, Leeds Cathedral, the Queen's Ecumenical College in Birmingham, and the Batley Mosque were also part of these tours, as was areception by the MCC at Lord's Cricket Ground, the birth-place of cricket.

St. Peter's has also played against The Royal Household Cricket Club of Her MajestyQueen Elizabeth at Windsor Castle, and is due to return there in 2018. In 2017 it travelled to Portugal and played Muslim, Hindu and Jewish teams in preparation for Pope Francis' trip to the country for the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Fatima.

The team's tours have been covered by a vast network of media channels like The Times of England, the New York Times, The Guardian, The Hindustan Times, Al Jazeera, Gulf News, The Times of Israel, Dawn (from Pakistan), The Jamaica Observer, Vatican Radio, and L'Osservatore Romano.


